Introduction

Founded in 1873 by the School Sisters of Notre Dame, The College of Notre Dame of Maryland was the first Catholic college for women to award the four-year baccalaureate degree. Notre Dame's fundamental dedication to young women endures today, even as the mission has expanded to serve working adults, both male and female.

The College of Notre Dame of Maryland educates a diverse population at the undergraduate and graduate levels (The Women's College, the Weekend College for working women and men, and the Graduate Studies program). Notre Dame students are part of a vibrant learning community that provides a high-impact education emphasizing professional and personal knowledge, development, and integrity.

Notre Dame is located in a residential neighborhood in the northern part of Baltimore, Maryland, the College benefits from both a beautiful campus environment and proximity to the city's businesses and transportation, as well as cultural, recreational, and professional opportunities.

Purpose

The primary purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate the smooth transfer from CCBC to Notre Dame's Baccalaureate degree program after students earn their Associate degree from CCBC.

Admissions Statement and Credit Transfer

A. Notre Dame will:

1. Accept the general education requirements that CCBC students complete for their A.A., A.S., or A.A.T. degree.
2. Accept transfer-appropriate courses with a grade of “C” or better, up to a maximum of 64 credits in transfer.
3. Provide concurrent advisement opportunities for CCBC students.

Students desiring to enter the bachelor’s degree program(s) must apply to Notre Dame and meet the requirements for admission to these programs as indicated on the College’s website and/or the current College catalog. Students must be admitted as a degree seeking student to be eligible for participation under this articulation agreement.

Financial Aid/Scholarships

College of Notre Dame has a long-standing commitment to helping students and their families make a Notre Dame education possible. Our Financial Aid Office works with each student to develop a financial aid package which may be a combination of:

- scholarships
- grants
- loans
- work study

Financing options, such as long-term loans and student employment, are provided for those assuming all the expenses on their own.

In collaboration with the Agreement Notre Dame will:

1. Award scholarships to qualified transfer students as outlined in the Notre Dame Learn for Life and Financial Aid brochures.
2. Provide assistance throughout the financial aid process and distribute information on external scholarships targeted to transfer students.
